She also worked in the mine-sweeping section of the British Admiralty, where she was involved in the planning of D-Day. She met and married her husband, William Fowler, in London, where he was an officer in the US Fifth Army. After the war, they moved to the Chicago area and then moved to Bogota, Colombia, where Enid taught and directed plays at Colegio Nueva Granada. They also lived in Spain and then retired to San Miguel De Allende, Mexico. After her husband died in 1994, Enid moved to the Milwaukee area to be with her family.
