



## Marshall Savick

Marshall Savick found peace on Monday, March 11, 2013, at the age of 75 years. Survived by his wife of 24 years, Maureen McClone; his daughters Jill Savick and Sherri (Dan) Hutten; granddaughters Margaret, Kelsey, and Olivia; and son Wesley (Lourey) Savick; his former wife, Judy Savick; sisters Caryl Berger, Elaine Savick (Michael Hindin) and Sandy (Neil) Petersen; his aunt Dorothy Bubrick; and is further survived by nephews, nieces, cousins, and a large group of friends. He was preceded in death by David and Dorothy Savick. As a young man, Marshall had varied and interesting life experiences ranging from playing percussion in dance bands to performing in award winning marching bands in high school and college. He had a lifetime passion for photography, securing a job in print photography for newspapers in the Fox Valley in the early 60s. He made the switch from print to television as a news camera man and production, working for both Channels 6 and 4. One of his favorite side ventures in the 1970s was playing the role of Mary Holiday on the Mary Holiday Show, with WTMJ radio host, Doug Dahlgren. He then worked for several ad agencies and also established his own photography studio doing work for companies such as Kohl's Department Store. His work then took him to Channel 10 as a videographer for 20 plus years on shows such as Outdoor Wisconsin and traveling the world to shoot the program Tracks Ahead. He traveled to Russia to film the documentary, "Clay Stomp: A Healing Way," which won the national PBS Gabriel Award. His favorite assignments were the arts programs, especially those featuring the

Milwaukee Ballet. Marshall was a lifelong patron of the arts in Milwaukee, including the Milwaukee Ballet, the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, the Florentine Opera Company, and Theatre X, one of the oldest operating experimental theater ensembles in the U.S. Memorial donations may be made to the Milwaukee Ballet or a charity of your choice.
